- 1. What were France and Spain in search of when they first left their countries to sail west? A western route to Asia
- 2. What was John Smith's major contribution to the Jamestown settlement? John Smith led the colony to work and build a stronger colony.
- 3. Describe the differences between Spain's and France's relationship with the Native Americans?

Spain's relationship with the Native Americans was rigid leading to violence while France was more adaptive to the Native Americans which led to cooperation and trade.

- 10. After France failed to find the Northwest Passage, what were the motivating factors for colonization?

- 11. What were the original motivating factors for establishing the Jamestown settlement? Adventure and economic recovery from England's suffering economy
- 12. How did the Jamestown settlement change from being a company colony to a royal colony? The London Colony lost their charter, so the King of England declared the colony a royal colony where the King appointed a governor to rule over the colony.

13. Where did the French settle in North America?

North Carolina to Maine, Canada, St. Lawrence River reaching Montreal, Quebec, Great Lakes
